#### Cerner Diet Order, Diet Modifier and Food Allergy Changes

#### **Purpose**

# Revise Cerner Diet Orders, Diet Modifiers and Food Allergies to streamline the ordering process and standardize practice across the IUH system

- Minimize the number of diet orders by eliminating synonyms, resulting in one primary diet order
- Eliminate diets that are not evidence-based
- Rename diets and diet modifiers to correspond with current nutrition recommendations
- Eliminate unnecessary duplication between primary diet orders and diet modifiers
- Eliminate unnecessary duplication between diet modifiers and food allergies

#### **Results**

- Number of primary diet orders reduced from 168 to 94
- 157 synonyms eliminated
- Number of diet modifiers reduced from 100 to 42
- 18 diet modifiers that currently are both diet modifiers and food allergies will become food allergies only

#### **Next Steps**

- The changes will be outlined in detail in the Clinical IS Update in November
- The changes will be effective on Monday, December 11, 2017 after the close of Room Service
- Registered Dietitians will convert revised diet orders to the new
- versions
- Dietetic Technicians will visit affected patients, explain the change in the diet order, and distribute a revised menu
